## THE EUROPEAN UNION AND THE EUROPEANS

The history of Europe begins in Crete, in 3,000 B.C. and develops over 5,000 years until November 1, 1993, when the Maastricht Treaty comes into force and the European Union is created.

The European Union is inspired by Europe's cultural, religious and humanist heritage, defending universal values: human rights, freedom, democracy, equality and the rule of law.

The European Union wants to be "united in diversity" and open to all states



## GENESIS OF THE PROJECT

The idea, which has guided me to make this documentary, is the search for a European identity, but also to better identify the diversity of Europe, its history, its cultural and artistic heritage, its inhabitants and its customs.

I have the feeling that, despite important regulations such as the objective of the European Green Deal enshrined in European environmental legislation, the concept of the European Union is still, today, too theoretical. Programmes such as Erasmus or the right to the European Health Insurance Card identifies us as Europeans, but I wonder whether European citizens, deep down, feel like Europeans.

Young Europeans will have to face major challenges such as climate change in an increasingly global world. They are the future.

Young people must be listened to in order to move forward with European unity, based on diversity.

The peoples of Europe have been in de facto relations for 25 centuries. From the Athens of Pericles to the present day

## LOGLINE

Europa sails trough European seas and rivers and travels to places chosen for their contribution to the European Heritage, in search of its diversity, sharing with its inhabitants the history, culture and traditions of the place..

## SINOPSIS

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Documentary of 36 hours in 3 years; 12 sequences of 1 hour.

The sailboat Europa, sails trough European seas and rivers visiting places chosen for their contribution to the European Heritage and recognized through the European Heritage Label, and/or Unesco Heritage.

The film crew travels to selected locations in Europe to film the diversity of European history, culture and traditions, highlighting what they have brought to Europe and its heritage. An invitation to the viewer to better understand the meaning of unity in diversity. A journey to bring the U.E closer to its citizens.

A trip in which young people from EU countries are invited to talk about their concerns about the changes that are coming and the future they want for Europe

A journey in which people from the chosen places participate to perceive the soul and personality of its inhabitants.

A meeting with Europeans from different countries to see if, despite their deep local roots, they feel European and to highlight how, through a recognized diversity, they are part of a common European identity.

A trip in which the universities of the chosen places are invited to collaborate through the Faculties of Histoira and Audiovisual

#### CHARACTERISTICS

#### The Documentary is::

**Dinamic:** The spectator travels through Europe visiting places that are part of European heritage, discovering their diversity

**Didáctic:** It is an encounter with the history of Europe and its traditions from its beginning, with the Minoan civilization, to the creation of the European Union.

Participativo: The Universities of the chosen places are invited to collaborate through the Faculties of History and Audiovisual. It is proposed that groups of students from both faculties can give their opinion on the script of the documentary, both from a historical and filming point of view. el punto de vista histórico como de rodaje.

#### TO WHOM IS IT ADDRESSED?

European media interested in offering a documentary on the history of Europe and its heritage.

#### PROJECT OBJECTIVES

invite, through a documentary, viewers, to the European seas and rivers in search of the diversity of European heritage and its history.

Know and better understand the different cultures that they are part of the history of Europe and its traditions, visiting places that have the distinction of European Heritage Label or are part of the Heritage of the UNESCO.

Better understand the importance of the European Union and the symbolism of the formula: «Europe, the union in the diversity".

Listen to the youth. The Europe of the future.

### IMPLEMENTATION

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The persons and institutions of the chosen places are informed of the project by sending the dossier and letter of introduction by mail.

Contact the local university. It is proposed to collaborate in the project. Students from the Faculties of History and Audiovisual are created and invited to answer the following questions:

A) Faculty of History

What are the site's contributions to European Heritage?

What are the traditions that local people identify with?

B) Audiovisual School:

How would they organize pre-production and filming of the documentary? Extras. Casting. etc.

Meeting of both groups and consideration/adaptation of proposals to the script.

Pre-production. (3 weeks). (Permits, places, etc.).

Shooting. (2 weeks per chapter).

Post production and editing work. (3 weeks per chapter).



## SCRIPT

Dawn breaks on the high seas. Europe is sailing towards its destination. The sound of the sea is mixed with a popular melody. Traditional music, as part of the culture, will accompany us during the voyage.

Europa arrives in port. Meeting with a local fisherman. We have breakfast with him while he talks about his life in the past. He tells us about the fishing and the climate when he was young. He tells us about the life of his ancestors. Of their customs. Of the Europe of the past, the present and the future.

From the hand of a student we learn about the history of the place and what has been its contribution to the European Heritage. Meeting with an elderly local person (farmer, teacher, etc.) He tells us about his life. When he was young, his customs and traditions. How the world has changed and the current problems.

We continue with the visit to historical and important places for their contribution to the European Heritage.

Meeting with a local person. We go together to the market. He tells us about the typical local products. We go to his house. He prepares us a dinner based on a traditional recipe. Gastronomy as a cultural tradition and part of the intangible heritage of Unesco. A group of young guests arrives for dinner. The local fisherman and the elderly person also come. At the same time, while having dinner they give their opinion about Europe, the European Union, the present and the future.

They discuss the extent to which they feel European despite their local or national roots, the risks and opportunities of Europe in an increasingly changing society. What they would like Europe to be like in the future.

Each person participating in each step of the script will briefly address the following questions during the interview:

- Despite my deep local ties, I also feel European.
- What future do I wish for Europe?

After dinner, we all go together to listen to music and enjoy traditional dances.

At midnight, Europe sets sail for its next destination.

## CHAPTER 1: GREECE CRETA





Sunrise on the high seas. Europa sails to Heraklion, its next destination... Meeting with Leonidas, a local fisherman. We have breakfast with him while he tells us what fishing and life was like in the past. Consequences of climate change. How he lives in the present. Advantages and opportunities since he became a European citizen.

Visit with Helena, a history student, of the Palace of Knossos (Unesco Heritage). Encounter with the history of the Minoan civilisation. We leave the Palace and travel through the interior of the island.

Meeting in an inland village with Dimitri, farmer and stockbreeder. He tells us what life was like as a young man in the countryside. He talks about the impact of climate change on olive trees, grapes and barley. He discusses what farming is like today. His vision of Europe and Greece as part of it.

We continue our journey to the Samaria Gorge, (Unesco World Heritage Site), discovering local customs and traditions.

Visit to the cities of Rethymon and Chania. Venetian and Turkish influence. On the way to Heraklion we visit the house of the painter El Greco and, once in the capital, the house of the writer Kazanzakis. In a handicraft workshop we are shown how the traditional instrument the lyre is made. Its history and tradition. We visit the cathedral and learn about the importance of the Greek Orthodox Easter. Visit of the emblematic places of Heraklion. Its history and contribution to the European Heritage.



After dinner we all go together to listen to traditional music and dances. We are accompanied by Leonidas and Dimitri.


